ACCEPTANCE OF MERGER OF HANCOCK COUNTY INTO THE IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY CERTIFICATION OF THE NIACOG HOUSING TRUST FUND AS A FUNDED HOUSING TRUST FUND

WHEREAS, the NIACOG Housing Trust Fund, Inc. (NIACOG HTF) is an established Local Housing Trust Fund (LHTF) serving Cerro Gordo and Floyd Counties; and,

WHEREAS, Homeward Inc. will no longer serve as an established LHTF for Franklin, Hancock, Kossuth, Mitchell, Winnebago, and Worth Counties upon completion of the 2022 funding year; and

WHEREAS, creating a joined Local Housing Trust Fund (LHTF) that is certified by the Iowa Finance Authority to receive funding, would permit NIACOG HTF to assist families under the State Housing Trust Fund for the entire 8-county region; and

WHEREAS, beginning January of 2023 the State Housing Trust Fund dollars will be administered by the NIACOG HTF under the direction its Board of Directors, and NIACOG staff will provide day-to-day management that target the needs of the residents of respective counties;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Board of Supervisors of Hancock County hereby agree to the merger with NIACOG HTF and their existing certification as an Iowa Finance Authority funded agency, as related to the State Housing Trust Fund,

Resolution No. 2022-013

A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS FOR THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan Act and,

WHEREAS, Hancock County applied for and has received the first half of funds for the American Rescue Plan Act, herein referred to as "ARPA," totaling \$1,032,376.50. The County anticipates the second half of the funds for ARPA to be received by the end of fiscal year June 30, 2022.

WHEREAS, the Hancock County Board of Supervisors has reviewed requests and determined which will qualify for ARPA and

WHEREAS, based on the distribution guidelines from the US Department of Treasury, the following projects have been approved for the use of said funds:

- Water and sewer infrastructure improvements at Eldred Sherwood Park for Conservation not to exceed \$374,783 to be funded with ARPA funds.
- HVAC system in the Law Enforcement Center and Courthouse not to exceed \$2,212,500 with up to \$1,689,970 to be funded with ARPA funds.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Hancock County Board of Supervisors endorses the disbursement of American Rescue Plan Act Funds for the items listed and authorizes the Auditor to make these payments as they are presented.
